To see if the Town will vote to establish a new Capital Reserve Fund for the purpose of Legal fees to be known as Legal Capital Reserve Fund to raise and appropriate the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) to be placed in this fund; and to designate the Board of Selectmen as agents. (Majority vote required). Recommended by the Board of Selectmen and Budget Committee.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Twenty Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) for the disposal and trucking fees at the transfer station and with said funds to come from the Transfer Station Special Revenue Fund. (Majority vote required).

11. To see if the Town will vote to establish a new Capital Reserve Fund for the purpose of acquiring a forestry vehicle to be known as Forestry Vehicle Capital Reserve Fund and to appropriate the sum of Three Thousand Two Hundred Dollars (\$3,200.00) from the unreserved fund balance and to designate the Board of Selectmen and the Fire Chief as agents. This amount was raised from the sale of the old forestry truck in 2010. (Majority vote required). Recommended by the Board of Selectmen and Budget Committee.

12. To see if the Town will vote to establish a new Capital Reserve Fund for the purpose of town buildings maintenance to be known as Town Building Maintenance Capital Reserve Fund to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) to be placed in this fund; and to designate the Board of Selectmen as agents. (Majority vote required). Recommended by the Board of Selectmen and Budget Committee.

13. To see if the Town will vote to establish a new Capital Reserve Fund for the purpose of purchasing gravel to maintain roads known as Gravel Maintenance Capital Reserve Fund: to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) to be placed in this fund; and to designate the Board of Selectmen as agents. (Majority vote required). Recommended by the Board of Selectmen and Budget Committee.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Four Hundred Twenty Two thousand Dollars (\$422,000.00) for the replacement of the Cross Road Bridge project. Out of this amount Three Hundred Thirty Six Thousand Dollars (\$336,000.00) to come from State Aid Bridge funds with the remaining Eighty Six Thousand Dollars (\$86,000.00) to come from the Construction & Reconstruction Bridges Capital Reserve Fund, created in 1992. This appropriation is non-lapsing until the completion of the project or five years (2016), whichever is sooner. If the State Aid Bridge funds are not received, this appropriation will be null and void. (Majority vote required). Recommended by the Board of Selectmen and Budget Committee.

15. To take up any other business as may legally come before this meeting.

Bernie Cutter asked Police Chief Andersen why the police truck wasn't marked. Chief Andersen explained that being marked caused drivers to signal other drivers of upcoming police presence causing traffic to slow down until they passed the police. Discussion was followed by a hand vote and the results to leave the vehicle unmarked was decided.
