2. To receive the reports of the Town Officers of Goshen and take any necessary action thereon.

Moderator Mary Walter calls meeting at 6:31 p.m. The Moderator spoke about the recent town election that took place on Tuesday, March 12, 2019. She briefly explained there was an issue with the election time. She introduced Christine Fillmore, an attorney working as the town's legal counsel to explain the situation and what could be done with it.

Christine Fillmore explained that the warrant stated that we would have an election to choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year but did not however state when the polls would be open or when the polls would be closed. There was a mistake in the warrant. There is a method in the law to address the problem when there is an issue like this. The selectmen can vote to hold a Special Town Meeting, with a hearing the week before that explains what the Special Town Meeting is for. They will post a warrant for the Special Town Meeting, there will be 1 question, "to ratify the results of Article 1." If it passes, the people who were elected can be sworn in. If it does not pass then we will go to the Attorney Generals office to figure out what to do. Her explanation was followed by much discussion.

Moderator Mary Walter proceeded to receive the reports of the Town Officers of Goshen and take any necessary action thereon.

Article 09 Exhaust System

To see if the town will vote to establish a Exhaust System Capital Reserve Fund under the provisions of RSA 35:1 for a Exhaust System for the Fire Station and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,500 to be placed in this fund. Further, to name the Selectmen as agents to expend from said fund. Recommended by the Board of Selectmen and Budget Committee. (Majority Vote Required.)

ARTICLE PASSES

Article 10 Grange Grant

To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$38,720 to be added to the Grange CRF previously established. This sum to come from unassigned fund balance. No amount to be raised from taxation. Recommended by the Board of Selectmen and Budget Committee. (Majority vote required.)

ARTICLE PASSES

Article 11 Dump Truck

To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to enter into a 7 year lease agreement in the amount of \$170,000 for the purpose of leasing a Plow Truck, and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$27,400 for the first year's payment for that purpose. This lease agreement contains an escape clause. Recommended by the Board of Selectmen and Budget Committee. (Majority vote required.)

MOTION TO AMEND ARTICLE

To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to enter into a 7 year lease agreement in the amount of \$170,000 for the purpose of leasing an **AT LEAST**, **30,000 GVW Dump/Plow Truck**, and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$27,400 for the first year's payment for that purpose. This lease agreement contains an escape clause. Recommended by the Board of Selectmen and Budget Committee. (Majority vote required.)

To see if the town will vote to establish a Fire Department Vehicle Capital Reserve Fund under the provisions of RSA 35:1 for Vehicles for the Fire Department and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$30,000 to be placed in this fund. Further, to name the Selectmen as agents to expend from said fund. Recommended by the Board of Selectmen and Budget Committee. (Majority Vote Required.)

To take up any other business as may legally come before this meeting.
